Ridin' Drag

After supper, a bit of reading and an arpeggio exercise with the mandolin, I walked up the hill towards the garden where a restful chore awaited me.

Back behind the big uptop garden, I am currently re-configuring our twin compost bins. A request has been made for fresh organics with which to amend the soil of several of my wife's raised garden beds. I pull out my screed, drop it over the wheelbarrow and pile on a measure of compost from the soon-to-be deconstructed bin. Then a garden rake, turned upside down is applied in a back and forth motion. Soon enough, the finest, decomposed elements will slip through the screed's wire mesh into the barrow.

This is rhythmic work, and my rake moves in waltz time. I maintain this tempo until the wheelbarrow is full and the heap of compost exhausted. My tools are stored and the fresh material tarped to protect it from rain and any freewheeling seed sown by the wind. By now it is dusk, my preferred time for rest and contemplation.

I sit and meditate on the wonder of arpeggios. Until a bat swooped in. Then three. While their silhouettes flit past the sliver of a vagabond moon, clematis beam in the lowering light, and the promise of summer takes my hand.
